



## Potential funding sources for village halls in Shropshire,

### Telford and Wrekin

[Shropshire and Telford Community Energy](https://stcenergy.org.uk) (STCE) are a Community Benefit Society dedicated to facilitating the establishment of community-owned clean energy schemes and distributing the arising financial benefits across the whole community. STCE offer grants generated by the Twemlows Solar Farm near Whitchurch. These grants fund energy saving and renewable projects across Shropshire and Telford. Preference is given to organisations with a turnover under £60k, but larger organisations may be funded.

STCE have already funded work at Park Lane Community Centre, the United Reformed Church (URC) in Shrewsbury, Harmer Hill and Rushbury Village Halls, the full list of past beneficiaries can be found here: <https://stcenergy.org.uk/community-benefit-funding/>

- There is a VCSE (Voluntary, Community and Social Enterprise) Community Building Energy Efficiency grant scheme run by the Government which offers funding for advice (including independent energy assessments) and capital grants for energy efficiency measures. This is open to charities or similar organisations, but not Parish councils. For guidance on applications, see:

- There are various Lottery funded schemes also available (not necessarily for energy projects), in particular Awards For All, which from the 15<sup>th</sup> November 2023 are increasing their grant level to £20,000 to fund projects running for up to two years. See:

Where they can, they identify partners and funds to deliver this infrastructure.
